

Who do you think you are?

Do you think you have Quaker ancestors? Did they settle in Lancaster, York or Adams Counties in Pennsylvania? Did they move west into Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, or Iowa?

Many Quakers (Religious Society of Friends is the formal name) came from England, Ireland, Scotland, some even by way of Holland. Most came into Pennsylvania and moved west through Chester, Lancaster, York and Adams Counties. Here are the names of those who settled and worshiped from the mid-seventeen hundreds through the mid-eighteen hundreds near Newberrytown, Redlands and Warrington Meetings in York County and Huntington Meeting in Adams County. By 1862, members had moved west with the Western Migration, and Redlands was closed; the meetinghouse and its cemetery have been under the care of Menallen Friends Meeting, Biglerville, PA since then.

If you find an ancestral name, (and even if you don't) you might want to join the Redlands Reunion on Sunday, August 14, 2011 to celebrate the 200th year of Redlands Meetinghouse, built in 1811. This stone building, which sits in a grove of white oak trees, is beautifully preserved, complete with hand-hewn benches, fireplaces and wood stoves. A number of activities are being planned, including a look at Quakers and their activities through time, a picnic, a quilting bee and tours of the Redlands and Newberrytown cemeteries.
